

BACKGROUND

MESA Track, a living database of malaria projects that enables malaria professionals to know **who** is doing **what**, **where**, and **when** to expect new results and emerging evidence.

Thus increasing cooperation among investigators, research institutions, national program managers and staff, policymakers, implementers and funding agencies.

MESA Track aims to facilitate global engagement and it is the base for the prioritisation of funding and identification of gaps in knowledge.



OBJECTIVE

The objective of MESA Track is to encourage open science sharing such that research investments are visible, accessible, shareable and referenceable to foster collaboration, avoid duplication of efforts and establish a base for robust research prioritisation.


METHODS


The database is carefully populated by:




Deep dives


The Deep Dives are a "one-stop-shop" with descriptive evidence synthesis on a given malaria topic or research question.
